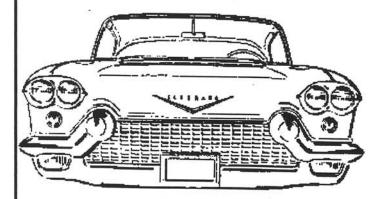


ON OUR COVER-

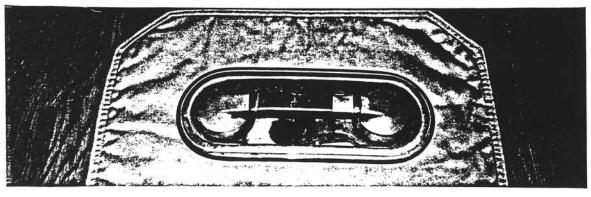

FINALLY, A TRUNK KIT FOR YOUR 57/58 BROUGHAM

Dear Brougham enthusiast,

The Brougham has without question the most complicated trunk upholstery set ever devised by man. To make your life easier you may wish to consider making the very intelligent and time saving decision to purchase our pre-assembled trunk kit. You may already realize that this is the best way to go if you have tried to use your old parts for patterns. Unless you have a really perfect unmolested original car you have no doubt realized that many, if not most of your old parts, or what is left of them are virtually unrecognizable, and are useless as patterns. Even parts from near perfect original cars will crumble into worthless chunks of disintegrating cardboard if you look at them wrong. If you have a car where the trunk upholstery was previously re-done by amateurs, your situation is hopeless.

Sixteen years of collecting the best parts from many different cars has been put to good use in reconstructing perfect replica masters of the OEM patterns. This diligence was invaluable for use in the faithful replication of the very intricate and expensive dies that were required to fabricate the cardboard and floor mating parts precisely to OEM specs.

We went through all this trouble and expense because many years ago we wasted about 40 hours labor in a hopeless attempt to precisely replicate these difficult parts by hand with upholstery cardboard, razor blades a scissors. Just for laughs try that on the hinge cover parts if you do not understand what I mean. Then we wasted another 40 hours doing the upholstery work and installation. Vanity of vanities, grasping at the wind as King Solomon once wrote. While this trunk interior looked better than an old one it was far from what we wanted. It looked home made no matter how hard we tried. I swore I never would do another trunk set until proper tooling was built with which to do the job to OEM standards. Needless to say this project has been planned for a long time, and it has cost unbelievable amounts of time and money to see it to fruition. We have even gone as far as to custom order a truckload of cardboard large enough for the trunk lid upper trim panel. You can not buy upholstery cardboard big enough for this part even if you are friends with the Pope! The labor bills for pattern work, research, development, and die building were astronomical! We were working with the best patterns we could find over the years, but in essence still forty-year old junk that was barely recognizable. This made for a lot of time consuming guesswork and trial and error sessions, which caused many costly die revisions during the development of this project. We even corrected a few factory mistakes along the way!

To develop and replicate the swedged metal eyelets was a huge job in itself. Of course as with most Brougham parts there were no identical replacements available at any price, though we searched the world over for three years! We had no choice but to build special forming dies for this precision part at enormous expense. We had come too far to compromise at this point. Most people close their eyes to such difficult details, then wonder why they wind up with an inferior restoration. These details are what separate the men from the boys in the restoration world. They make the difference between an exceptional OEM quality finished product, which the Brougham richly deserves, and the slop that we usually see at car shows. These metal parts have a definite purpose. They act as spacers to keep the cardboard parts from puckering and warping because they will not allow the screws to be over tightened. They also act as strengtheners to keep the cardboard parts firmly attached to the car, as well as serving to create a very refined look.

Most people would simply use an incorrect trim screw instead of going through all this trouble. We could not bring ourselves to install the trunk upholstery without the correct structural and decorative parts that are so critical to proper OEM fit and appearance, regardless of cost. Now we can supply pre-installed, exact replicas of these parts in highly polished stainless steel, which will outlive all of us, instead of the OEM chrome plated steel which will go bad before we do. We have copied the unusual shape of these parts right down to the last detail.

As many of you know in years past we have also spent a lot of time and money custom weaving and dying the fabric as well.

The point is that our ready to install kit will easily pay for itself twice over in upholstery shop labor savings. If you compare the labor cost of 80 hours or more x \$50 per hour for an inferior job, this kit becomes a real bargain. You will not have to do the job over again at even greater expense because you were dissatisfied and you will have paid less money to begin with. Less cost and aggravation over all! With our kit you wind up with a ten times better, flawless OEM quality installation for half the price of the home made, Mickey Mouse version! No matter how good an upholstery man you have he can not do the job successfully without the correct patterns. Even with the patterns he could not hope to duplicate some of these complex shapes by hand, or duplicate without error some of the finer details that we, having learned from experience, build into our pre-sewn kits. The learning curve can be very expensive! Delivered pre-assembled as they are, your trunk upholstery could be installed in only a few hours. With the detailed instructions that accompany the kit and our assembly hardware kit, which includes every last screw that is required for installation, you can not go wrong! The fit and finish of our kits are superior to the very high OEM quality standards.

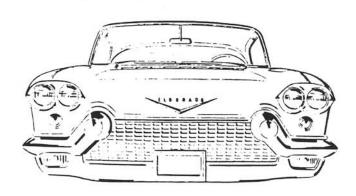
For you die hard do it yourselfers we can also supply the die cut parts, fabric, speaker cover netting, jack curtain clips, split rivet sets, metal eyelets and related swedging tools as well as complete installation hardware kits separately. Unless you know of an extremely talented upholstery shop that works very inexpensively, have an original 8:40 x 15 tire to fit the wheel cover to and an excellent original set of patterns, I am quite sure that our pre-sewn and assembled kit will be your better value however.
