
### Eldorado Brougham No. 273

For some time now there have been two rumors coming out of Ft. Worth, Texas, regarding the 1957 Eldorado Brougham No. 273. (This car has been mistaken in recent years for No. 274 even on the internet. My research shows No. 274 has for many years resided in Charlotte, North Carolina). One rumor is that the car was once owned by Elvis Presley, and the other rumor is that over \$350,000 has been spent on its restoration. Since I am an avid fan of the Eldorado Brougham and since I only live 250 miles away from Ft. Worth, I decided it was time to check out No. 273.


My quest was not to confirm or deny these rumors, but rather to see for myself the quality of the restoration and report same back to the BOA. It is well documented that Elvis Presley did own the chief rival to the Eldorado Brougham, i.e., the 1956 Continental Mark II. By the way, Presley's Mark II can be seen on display at Gallery Furniture Store in Houston, Texas, having been bought by "Mattress Mack" the owner of the store for the sum of \$250,000 plus commission at the Presley Las Vegas auction in October of 1999.

In consulting the roster prepared by Cy Strickler, the first president of the BOA, dated 1977 through 1978, we find the following about No. 273 from that roster: the exterior color code for the car is 110 which is ebony (black), and the interior code is 1281 which is light gray parisienne cloth with white leather, and it was shipped from the factory to North Carolina.



Through a fellow member of the BOA, I received the name of the restorer of the car and set up a visit for Saturday, April 29, 2000, in connection with my yearly trip to Pate Swap Meet at the Texas Motor Speedway. I am happy to report that I found No. 273 to be receiving a meticulous and the most perfect restoration ever to be bestowed on an Eldorado Brougham. The restorer has consulted with several BOA members in the process and has spent 5 1/2 years restoring No. 273. He began work on the car on Thanksgiving Day of November 1994. The restorer says he lacks approximately 240 hours before finishing same and hopes to have it completely restored in July of 2000. No. 273 has none of the "goodies" i.e., compact, cigarette case, perfume bottle with atomizer, etc.; but when finished it will be the most perfect Eldorado Brougham on the face of the planet! It is a "frame up" restoration as opposed to a "frame off" restoration and no expense is being spared. The restorer and owner wish to remain anonymous at this time, and this article will respect those wishes. I am authorized however by the owner and restorer to have published the pictures I took of the restoration as I found it on April 29, 2000. At that time the hood and front fenders were off as well as seats yet to be reinstalled. Enjoy the pictures. I was invited to view the car underneath and was amazed at the beauty. I wish to give credit to Stephen Nadon of Ontario, Canada, for the motivation given to me by him to do this article and take the pictures.



One fine paint job is evident in this side photo. That stainless is as new as is the fin crown.





Here is a real tricky proposition. The Brougham trunk can make or break a restoration.





The parisienne cloth with white leather will be stunning and absolutely correct.

Today, I went to look at a '58 Eldorado Brougham parts car.



A Toronto fellow (who I don't personally know) is having an EB professionally restored at the Guild of Automotive Restorers Inc. This restoration shop is in Bradford Ontario, a neighboring town of Keswick. To complete his car they acquired a parts car (which was rumored to be originally from New Jersey). Once the Guild completes the restoration, they are willing to sell me what ever is left over from the parts car.

The parts car is Body Number 494 and indeed it is a parts car. It has no bumpers and is missing much of it's trim. The engine block is still there and from what I could tell it still had it's air ride components. The interior is devastated, but the seat frames and dash are still intact.

The EB that is being restored is body number 627. It is Jamaican Green with a Trim Number of 6581 and paint code 132.



Today I received the information package from Cadillac Historical Services for my '58. My '58 EB was built on Oct. 23, 1957. This makes it 26 days younger than me! I am sad to report that it has fared the years better than I have.

BTW, the previous Brougham (Body # 401) was built the day before and posses the previous serial number:

401 is serial number 58P000609 402 is serial number 58P000610

The outlet code for my car is OWA. What are the chances that this outlet code stands for OTTAWA, Ontario? We do know that my car was an export and there is a high likely hood that it was originally sold in Canada? For those non-Canadians, Ottawa is on the border of Ontario and Quebec. The car came with the original '58 Licensee Plate, which were in fact Quebec Plates.

My guess is that it may have been sold in the Canadian Capital and then made residence in Quebec.

Hi Allan,

I received the Spring Newsletter just last week and wanted to touch basis with you on a couple of items.

I found Malcolm Graham's letter very interesting. He mentioned that there was Brougham sited on the Island of Malta. This has peaked my curiosity for several reasons. For one thing, I was born on the Island of Malta and it is not a large island and is not very densely populated. A Brougham will stick out very prominently. Secondly, the roads in Malta are not very long or very wide...a Brougham would have a heck of time squeezing between some of the buildings (many of which were built in the 1400's. But what a picture it would make. But I'm thrilled to know that the Brougham has found an sunny, warm location to live out the rest of it's life. I would love to find out more about this car.

Secondly, I have a proposition that may resolve (at least) some of the issues that you mentioned in the President's Message. As most of us are well aware, much of the documentation on the Air Ride, Cooling System and Electrical systems of the Broughams are somewhat obscure. I'm finding that the rebuild of these complex systems are some what of challenge.

I may have a bit of an advantage over some folks in that I have an Electrical Engineering background but even such, I find some of the systems difficult to follow. As a result I have re-drawn each and every electrical system of the 57 and 58 Brougham based on my car and the very difficult to read schematic in the Shop Manual. I have generated full-sized color schematics on a system by system basis with a fair amount of explanation of how each system works (electrically). The drawings have been done on my computer (in an application called Visio 5). They can of course be printed. I was wondering if you were interested in publishing the schematics and drawings in the Newsletter. Maybe we can put one or two systems in per Newsletter and cover the whole car over a period of a year or so.

In addition to the electrical system, I also have a detailed schematic of the Air Ride lines, valves etc. As well as the cooling system.

Here is an incomplete list of the drawings that I have to date:

Allan as you can see this is only about 90% of all the electrical systems. I do have the remaining 10% hand drawn and it would take a few weeks to complete them on the computer.

Would you be interested in adding these on an individual basis to the Newsletter, maybe as a Restoration Tip or Helper? The picture are very clear and of good quality.





Hope this message finds you well. Spring is two weeks old, and at writing, it is RAINING in London. However, the weather will change for the better and the worst of winter is over. And that means the car club activities will start soon!

The November '99 Car Collector printed the survey results on the Top 20 Cars of the Century. Divided into prewar and postwar models, the 1955-7 Chevrolet was rated the most popular autos. Moreover, NO '50's Cadillacs or other luxury marques were mentioned.

In February, I wrote to the editor and stated the results were misleading. To start, I used the 1953 Eldorado, the '53 Eldo sold at Barrett-Jackson, and of course, the '57-8 Eldorado Broughams to support my viewpoint. Guess what, my letter WAS printed in the April issue. My . Brougham description was omitted, but most of the letter was left intact.

I am well aware that Chevrolets are affordable for the "average" person, but the '57-8 Broughams had EVERYTHING. In fact, Nicky Wright stated the Brougham made a Rolls-Royce look like a Base Chevrolet. This was an exaggeration, but close to the point.

Equally significant, the '57 El Morocco was a big joke.

I do not object to '55-7 Chevrolets, but I see FAR TOO MANY in Ontario I sometimes wonder if ANY '50's Eldorados - especially the Eldorado Broughams - exist at all! In this regard, it would be great to have a Brougham Grand National. I will mail you a copy of my letter, and your feedback about the matter is most welcomed. Might you also consider publishing it in the next newsletter?

#### **Berating The Ratings**


I found the survey results in the November issue interesting. However, the postwar models are misleading, especially with regards to the 1950-92 models. The results stated that the 1955-57 Chevrolet ranked first, yet no Cadillacs or even Packards, Lincolns, or Chrysler Imperials were mentioned.

In 1984, the milestone Car Society rated all 1953-58 Eldorados as milestones. Indeed, if a survey were done on luxury vehicles, such as the 1953-56 Packard Caribbeans and the 1956-57 Lincoln Continental Mk II against the Eldorados, chances are good the 1953 Eldorado would come in first. Above all, a 1955-57 Chevrolet cannot be compared with any 1950s Cadillac, especially an Eldorado.

Congratulations, you're the winner of the "I hate Chevrolet" contest! Actually, you make a very good point. The criteria for different lists of great cars published over the past year has varied to allow a variety of makes and models to be acknowledged for their individual contributions to automotive history. Each of the automobiles was chosen for its significance to the advancement of the motorcar. In the postwar category, the '53 Eldorado (or any Eldorado for that matter) was not deemed to have made a significant mark on history. This can be argued to death, but the merits of the Chevrolet in 1955-1957 (V8 power to the mass market for example) greatly outweigh those of the Eldorado.
